respectful children while also taking care of ourselves.






Brotherhood of St. Andrew

Education for Ministry (EfM)

Location: Zoom Time: Tuesdays 7 – 9:30 PM EfM is a program of study developed by Sewanee Theological Seminary, University of the South, that involves study, theological reflection and worship. The course of study involves weekly reading (Bible and assigned Chapter for Year 1 and 2; assigned Chapter for Year 3 and 4) and class participation. EfM covers 4 years with each year covering a specific area of study: Year 1 Old Testament, Year 2 New Testament, Year 3 Church History and Year 4 Modern Theology and Ethics.
